
Day 32: Baby Wipes.

Day 37: Dryer Sheets.

Day 36: Laundry Pods.

Keeping it clean! Our bodies need food, and cleanliness, and that extends to our home. Laundry pods are a good donation as we can "break down" bulk containers into smaller packages, but we will accept small bottles of liquid detergent too.

Day 38: Toilet Cleaner.

We all go – it's best to go where it's clean. The tablet style cleaner is good for separating into smaller packages if needed, and in the tank will keep things cleaner longer. Small bottles of liquid cleaner or powdered cleaner is accepted as well.

Day 40: Dish Soap.

Dish soap can serve many functions for cleaning in a home if nothing else is available, so it goes beyond washing the dishes from dinner. Some people do have dishwashers in their homes, & could use pods, but dish soap is probably the best option.



Day 39: Spray Cleaner.
